- 100% new sails

- Crew houses/apartments available on Hankø island

Come on, it's not too late: just book your tickets to Norway for you and your team, step on that boat and race it, enjoy the half ton spirit 'Norwegian style' – you will not be disappointed! By the way, a second halftonner is in the process of being made available!











More Hankø news

Some changes in the entrylist, now counting 40 and the latest entry is Per Osen with «HeroIn». Per was present at Hankø 1983 as measurer in the control comittee - now sailing.

The Organizers are very happy with our main sponsors: the Norwegian Audi dealer Dahles Auto. They will bring a cool Audi to Hankø (normally a car free island...), or maybe display it on the fore deck of the IOR Maxi Ondine that will be moored at the clubhouse. Ondine was also present at Hankø 1983 – of course she will join us this year too with smokemachines and lights... which promises some great parties...

Another sponsor De IJssel/Double Coat (yacht paints) will show their products and give hints and advice at Hankø. If you are looking for a good local craftsman to take care of repainting your boat ... you can meet him at Hankø and you probably all know who he is...

Farther Bruin, also from Belgium, is representing the Farr dynasty of halftonners, which stands for speed & success! A low rating mixed with experienced crew and fragrances of speed—likely a delicious cocktail!

There will be 3 halftonners with an exclusive 'all female' team: **Midnight X** and **FoXy** from Norway and a British team led by Rosemary Nunn.

It must be mentioned that the boat that came in 4th place in 1983, **Fram VIII**, is restored to its original condition and will compete in Hankø.

Getting your boat (on her trailer) to Hankø

It's not too late, but the clock is ticking... However, transport is made easy by DFDS: for only 1900 EUR (after refund by the organizers) your convoy exceptionnel enjoys smooth handling by DFDS and once at Fredrikstad the Half Ton Class Norway takes all the cost of craning and logistics.











Ship your boat to Zeebrugge (BEL) latest on 3 or 4 AUG or to Immingham (GBR) and have it ferried directly to Hankø. When you arrive you will find your boat and a cold welcome drink... So don't miss the opportunity to come and sail your halftonner in Northern Europe's best waters for racing: Hankø!

And if coming with your own boat is too complicated, offer your team the opportunity to compete against the other halftonners on board a competitive local halftonner and enjoy the fantastic sailing area...

You will also love the atmosphere at Hankø Yacht Club as well as their fantastic food and great bar. I recommend «Maritas Special» and «GT cream»...

Where to stay? Still cabins and houses available to fair prices

Also remember: Norwegian currency is low - Norway is NOT expensive this year!!
